Statistical Data Report for June 2013, Released August 2013

Regional and State Unemployment (seasonally adjusted)

Regional and state unemployment rates were little changed in June. Twenty-eight states had unemployment rate increases, 11 states had decreases, and 11 states and the District of Columbia had no change, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Thirty-seven states and the District of Columbia had unemployment rate decreases from a year earlier, seven states had increases, and six states had no change. The national jobless rate was unchanged from May at 7.6 percent but was 0.6 percentage point lower than in June 2012.

Nevada had the highest unemployment rate among the states in June, 9.6 percent. The next highest rates were in Illinois and Mississippi, 9.2 percent and 9.0 percent, respectively. North Dakota again had the lowest jobless rate, 3.1 percent. In total, 19 states had jobless rates significantly lower than the U.S. figure of 7.6 percent, nine states and the District of Columbia had measurably higher rates, and 22 states had rates that were not noticeably different from that of the nation.




